According to the National Aphasia Association:

84.7%

of people surveyed had **never heard the term *aphasia***.*

But, from that same group surveyed:

84.1%

Aphasia is a communication disorder that is caused by trauma to specific parts of the brain. Stroke is the most common cause. Aphasia can affect speech, comprehension, reading and/or writing. Studies have shown intensive therapy to be the best approach to aphasia recovery at any stage.
